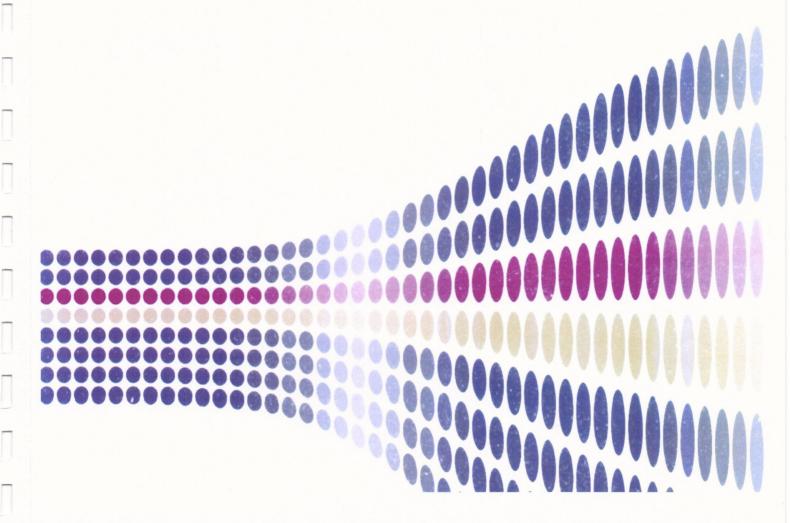

DIRECTORS REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the company, it gives me immense pleasure to present the Annual Report together with audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2024.

Economic Overview

Pakistan's economy has shown signs of stabilization in FY24, with inflation easing, a primary fiscal surplus, a controlled current account deficit, and a stable exchange rate. On the real economy side, the agriculture sector has performed exceptionally well, while large-scale manufacturing is poised for growth. As the year progressed, Pakistan's Balance of Payments stabilized with a series of Current Account Surpluses that were primarily led by a healthy growth in remittances and drop in imports as the economic slowdown persisted. The country's total foreign exchange reserves increased to USD14 billion at the year end, from USD9.2 billion on June 30, 2023.

In FY'24 the current account deficit narrowed to \$0.7bn, down from \$3.3bn the previous year. The country's GDP grew by 2.52% in the financial year 2023-2024 as compared to -0.2% last year. The agriculture sector, in particular, was a key driver of this growth, Agriculture grew by 6.3%, Services and industrial sector witness a paltry increase of 2.16% and -4.57% respectively.

Market Overview

The stock market witnessed exuberance in fiscal year 2024, as the benchmark KSE-100 increased by staggering 89.2% or 36,992 points, to close at the all-time high of 78,445 points. This also makes Pakistan the best performing market in the world with USD return of 94.4% in the year. With improved investor confidence, market turnover increased significantly as average daily volumes climbed up to 460.2 million shares and average daily value traded to PKR15.6 billion from 191 million shares and PKR6.1 billion, respectively of the previous year. Foreign investors bought equities worth USD124.2 million during the period under review where most of the local participants opted to book profits except insurance companies, and companies who were net buyers during the year under review.

Sector wise performance, Power, Banks and Fertilizer sector reported strong returns driven by dividend plays and cheaper valuations while E&Ps performance also reflected improved cash flows. Power generation achieved a return of 119% in FY24, followed by Banks, E&Ps and Fertilizer with robust annual returns of 115%, 73% and 65% respectively. Technology sector had a negative return in the period under review.



Company's Financial Overview

The Company posted operating revenue of Rs. 104.06mn during the period under review as compared to last year's Rs. 39.9mn. Before and after-tax (loss)/profit stood at Rs. 302.2mn and Rs. 272.6mn respectively, as compared to last year of Rs. (38.6)mn and (44.3)mn respectively. The equity of the Company as at the balance sheet date is Rs. 665.6mn (June 2023: Rs. 393.1mn), which translates into book value per share of Rs. 55.47 (June 30, 2023: Rs. 32.76).

Broking operations have posted a total revenue of Rs. 104.06mn in FY24, which is 160.28% when compared with FY23. Institutional and retail revenues increased by 110.39% and 226.90% respectively. On the other hand, operating and administrative have been increased by 85.27%.

Management Rating

The Company has been reaffirmed a management rating of BMR2 by the VIS Credit Rating Company Limited (VIS). The outlook on the assigned ratings is 'Stable'. The rating signifies strong compliance and risk management and sound external control, HR & infrastructure and financial management.

Entity Rating

The Company has been reaffirmed entity ratings of 'BBB+/A-2' (Triple B Plus/A-Two) by VIS Credit Rating Company Ltd. (VIS). The outlook on the assigned ratings is 'Stable'. This certification defines Adequate credit quality, Protection factors are reasonable and protected, Liquidity factors and company fundamentals are sound provides further confidence to the company's clientele with regards to the credibility and stability of the company.

Future Prospects

Overall direction of Pakistan' macroeconomic indicators is quite positive with receding international commodities prices including food and energy prices providing the much need cushion, SBP has continued with its monetary easing stance and it seems like we would be seeing a few more rounds of interest rate cuts in the current fiscal years. The Management feels that equity market is currently at an extremely attractive level and coupled with the recent approval of IMF program, the market is only set to rejoice, contributing to a better equity return for FY25. This would reflect positively on the pure agency business which is primarily equities broking.



Recommendation

The directors have not recommended any payout due, as the capital would be used for future expansion purposes.

Auditors

The auditors M/s. Grant Thornton Anjum Rahman., Chartered Accountants have retired and being eligible offer themselves for reappointment.

We have audited the annexed financial statements of **Insight Securities (Private) Limited** (the Company), which comprise the statement of financial position as at June 30, 2024, and the statement of profit or loss, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity, the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information, and we state that we have obtained all the information and explanations which, to the best of our knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purposes of the audit.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement of financial position, the statement of profit or loss, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows together with the notes forming part thereof conform with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan and give the information required by the Companies Act, 2017 (XIX of 2017), in the manner so required and respectively give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs as at June 30, 2024 and of the profit and other comprehensive loss, the changes in equity and its cash flows for the year then ended.
